Most importantly, we thank St John Vianney for the many life lessons he has provided us through his faith and life "Showing us the Way to Heaven".





















Year 4 Bingo Recycling Excursion

In Week 1 of this term, Year 4 began a special unit of project-based work on recycling, sustainability and waste reduction. As one of our entry events, Year 4 travelled to the Bingo recycling centre at Auburn.

We were very lucky as we were allowed to drive our bus through the main recycling plant and see the tractors and front-end loaders that helped move the waste, the big conveyor belt that is used to sort the different types of material, as well as the storage bays for the material when it is captured.

The Bingo staff took us through a number of lessons where we asked the question: 'Can we recycle a house?' And the answer was a big YES! We were able to take apart a model house piece by piece and divide the waste according to different materials. We also found out how many people we could fit inside!!

We made flow charts showing where different material comes from and what it can be recycled into. It was good working in groups to do this! We also used recycled material to plant some seeds in mini green-houses which were fun to make - they looked like a Starbucks Latte! We even got to talk to one of the Bingo truck drivers on the two-way radio. We ordered a big take-away from Hungry Jacks.

On the way home we stopped off at Prospect Reservoir for lunch and saw one of Sydney's main water storage areas as well as how the land is specially used for that purpose.












Year 3 Science Incursion

The day started with a **BANG!** Tuesday... One of the best days at school ever! Year 3 were lucky enough to spend the whole day at school doing experiments and seeing demonstrations from Ranger Jamie and Ranger Sid. We learnt so much about heat and how it affects the three states of matter - solids, liquids and gases.

The day began watching Ranger Jamie demonstrate how heat would pop a

balloon. He even put water in some and when they popped we got soaked! After that, he showed us all how adding fire to 'rocket fuel' would cause a gas and create heat.

Our class were all so clever, quickly realising that stomping on the ice was the best way, because it caused friction and therefore melted the ice really fast. Ranger Jamie was so impressed with our wisdom. My favourite part of the day was next. We put soda water into sealed bags and Ranger Jamie explained that

when we shook it, a gas formed and caused the bag to expand. Can you guess what happened next? Yes! It went POP! All over us! By the end of the experiment we were so drenched.



After we dried off a bit, we moved to the slime making station. This was a lot of fun! We used cornflour and water to create a very interesting mystery matter slime, it was a solid when we punched it, but when we moved our fingers through it slowly, it became a liquid... So weird! The last activity was when we moved to make our rockets. We were shown how adding bicarb soda to vinegar would create a reaction where a gas is made. It expanded a water bottle so much it felt as hard as glass!!! Ranger Jamie jumped on the bottle and suddenly... it exploded! The whole bottom of the bottle shot off, it was incredible to see.

We finally had to say goodbye to our ranger friends, but not before having a whole group silly photo. Although I went home very exhausted, I was smiling from ear to ear. It was such a wonderful day of learning and one that I will remember very fondly for years to come.


Find Your Treasure!

Dear Parents and Carers,

Children love board games. Not only are they entertaining, but board games are great for helping children to improve their concentration, memory, develop numeracy skills, social skills and language.

You can make a board game that combines your child's love of play with some of the subjects they are learning at school – and the wonderful thing is it is fun for the whole family!

What you will need:

- · A large piece of paper or cardboard
- . A die
- Coloured counters
- Thirty to 40 small cards
- Felt-tipped markers

Method:

- Work with your child to design a simple game map, with a starting line, a finishing line and progress squares in between.
- Sit down with your child and decide on three or four different topics that will form the basis for the questions in the game.
- Next, get your child to fill in each square on the game map with a word or symbol representing each of the topics.
- Now, without your child seeing, write 10 questions that cover each topic on the small cards. If you have younger children, it is a good idea to make some cards with easier questions to allow them to participate and feel included.
- Now it's time to play! Encourage everyone in your family to join in the fun.
- Each player has a turn at rolling the die, and the person who gets the highest number goes first. That player then rolls the die, and using their counter, moves forward along the board to the corresponding square.
- The person to the player's left then picks the top question card from the corresponding topic pile and reads it out aloud.
- If the player answers the question correctly, they remain on their square until their next go. If the answer is not right, they must move back one space.
- The winner of the game is the first to cross the finish line.

NAPLAN Online Readiness Test

In preparation for the 2019 NAPLAN Online, all CEDP schools will complete a NAPLAN Online Readiness Test in Term 3 of 2018. <u>ALL</u> Year 3 and Year 5 students at St John Vianney's will be participating in the NAPLAN Online Readiness Test during Week 6 (27/8 – 31/8).

Your child <u>WILL NOT</u> need any academic preparation for the school readiness test. This is <u>NOT</u> a test of their literacy and numeracy skills, but an opportunity for the students to experience the online test format. The school readiness test is a 'practice run' for schools to assess their technology ahead of NAPLAN Online. The readiness test is **NOT** an assessment of student ability. **NO RESULTS will be collated or sent home.**

Return & Earn Container Recycling

School hats, tracksuit pants and jackets should be washed regularly, repaired if needed (or replaced) and relabelled CLEARLY.

I know how costly uniforms are and we all need to continue encouraging the children to be more responsible for the care of their belongings. A clearly marked item can be quickly identified and returned to its owner!


