# Feast Day Of Our School's Patron Saint

On Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> August our school community celebrated the feast day of our patron saint, St John Vianney. It was a day of celebration, fun and prayer. The day began with the primary classes attending Mass and the infants' classes participating in a special prayer service in their classrooms. This was followed by a special celebration morning tea for the staff and Father O'Neill was our guest of honour.

Throughout the day, each grade worked on a special "Door of Mercy" for their classroom. In this Jubilee Year of Mercy we are reminded of God's call to be kind, caring, prayerful and forgiving people. St John Vianney's life is clear example of a special person, who responded to God's call, bringing the Good News of God's forgiving love to all. The highlight of the day was the look of surprise and amazement on the children's faces when they walked into the MPR and saw two jumping castles... Frozen and Spiderman! I heard lots of excitement in their conversations as the children greeted their parents in the afternoon. I'm sure all the activities from the day proved to be a springboard for lots of interaction when they arrived home!

The Feast of St Mary of the Cross Mackillop, 8th August

Mary of the Cross MacKillop is our first Australian saint and the founder of the Sisters of St Joseph. Mary MacKillop was certainly a woman worthy of recognition for her life, her faith and her work. She was an ordinary woman who lived an extraordinary life with a particular commitment to children and families, the poor and the disadvantaged and a commitment to providing education for all. She knew that God loved her and she responded to this love with confidence and courage as she faced the many personal, spiritual and professional battles along the way. Mary MacKillop, like Mother Teresa, firmly believed that 'We must teach more by example than by word'.

Mary MacKillop had the qualities of sheer determination, perseverance in the face of adversity, a diligent spirit of justice on behalf of those who were treated unfairly and a quiet belief in a God of love.

We see daily, at St John Vianney's so many wonderful examples of parents modelling the values lived by Mary MacKillop. Their extreme generosity of spirit and time for all children, not just their own, and ongoing kindness and compassion in times of challenging circumstances ......simply thank you to you all. You must at some level 'listen and believe in the whisperings of God in your heart' (St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, 1868) because the good and generous work you do for our community is inspiring. We are living in times when we are called to step beyond our own inner world and to show a deep belief in God and a commitment to our fellow man.

#### Religious Literacy Assssment - Year 4 & 6

In Religious Education, like in all other Key Learning Areas, teachers are continually assessing students' learning. #### LATE ARRIVALS TO SCHOOL

#### **UNMARKED UNIFORM and OTHER ITEMS**

A plea to parents ... PLEASE PUT YOUR CHILD'S NAME ON CLOTHING (jackets, ties, hats etc.) DRINK BOTTLES, LUNCH BOXES, and LUNCH BAGS!

School hats and jackets should be washed regularly, repaired if needed or replaced and re-labelled clearly with your child's name and class if this has faded or rubbed off.

Every day we end up with a pile of costly clothing and general items unclaimed. At the moment there is quite a collection in the Blue Room between the Year 3 & 4 classrooms. I know how costly uniforms are and we all need to be encouraging the children to be more responsible for the care of their belongings. A clearly marked item can be quickly identified and returned to its owner! Thank you to the parents who are already diligent in ensuring their child's items can be easily identified because they are clearly labelled.


