How can we respond in our own thoughts and actions to this gospel message?


*May we be immersed in the mercy of Christ

School Uniform

Parents are reminded that students will be required to wear their winter uniform in Term Two. However, due to the unseasonal weather we are asking parents to use their discretion in deciding which uniform is best suited, summer or winter, during the first 5 weeks of Term Two. **It will be compulsory for all children to be wearing their full winter uniform from Monday 29th May, Week 6 of Term 2.**

Please ensure that your child wears a jacket to school as it becomes colder so that they are comfortable and don't get sick. **Also, please make sure that all items of clothing are clearly labelled with your child's name and class.** Often, there are many items that are lost but do not have a child's name on them. This makes it difficult to find and hand clothing back to the owner.

ANZAC Day Activities

On ANZAC Day we commemorate the sacrifices that men and women have made over the years, and especially remembering the first ANZACS that fought at Gallipoli and in various campaigns throughout World War 1. Their sacrifices have helped shape our Australian nation. It is a part of our heritage and is a tradition that helps form our Australian identity.

NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual national assessment for all students in **Years 3, 5, 7 and 9.** All students in these year levels are expected to participate in tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

NAPLAN is the measure through which the government, education authorities, schools, teachers and parents can determine whether or not our students are meeting important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy. The tests provide parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. They also provide schools, states and territories with information about how education programs are working and what areas need to be improved. NAPLAN tests are just **ONE** aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process; they do not replace the extensive ongoing assessments made by teachers about each student's performance.

This year the NAPLAN test will take place **in Week 3 of Term Two, on Tuesday 9th May, Wednesday 10th May and Thursday 11th May.**

Road Safety

Please be aware of how you drive your car around the school. The safety of our children is essential at all times. Parking in front of the school is not possible for every parent, so please park your car in an appropriate place and take a walk to either drop off or pick up your child. When your child is dismissed, take the time to walk safely back to your car with them.

Please note: Under no circumstances are parents to park their cars in the staff car park or use the area as a drop off or pick up zone. This is a dangerous practice as it is a congested area with many blind spots and a serious accident could occur.


Speeding Offences

Pedestrian Crossings

1. In a queue of traffic, no part of your vehicle must stop on a pedestrian crossing.
2. Do not let your child in or out of a vehicle at a pedestrian crossing or in a No Stopping zone.

TERM 2 - PUPIL FREE DAYS

During Term 2 there will be two pupil free days. These days are in place to support the on-going professional learning of our staff. **There will be no school for the children on these days.**

The first staff development day will on Monday 24th April. The focus of this day is Numeracy. Staff will be working together to refine the teaching and learning strategies that they use with the students to extend their mathematical thinking and problem solving skills in Multiplication and Division. **This means there will be no school on this day and students will return to school in Term 2 on Wednesday 26th April, after the Anzac Day public holiday.**

The second staff development day will in week 5 of Term 2, on Monday 22nd May. This day will be a Spiritual Formation day for the staff, with a focus on scripture. **This day will be conducted off-site, so there will be no staff member on school grounds on this day.**

School Maintenance

During the holidays SJV's will be undergoing some maintenance to address Work, Health and Safety issues that currently exist. You would have noticed the temporary fencing around the pond area. Work will begin to fix the pond fencing, to level the ground in the area and repair the uneven area of the handball courts. Also, down pipes, some drainage and all the trip hazards around the school grounds will be repaired. We look forward to a new look after the holiday break!

It is a system requirement that child protection training be completed by all volunteers commencing work in our school and a briefing every second year for existing volunteers.

4. After successful completion of the module, fill out the form by typing your name, email address, contact number, contact address and the school you intend to volunteer at.
