# **APPLICATION FOR EXTENDED LEAVE**

Parents, as you know, it is very important that children attend school every day. Quite often leave is requested by parents for various reasons. While we understand that this may be necessary sometimes, it is not encouraged. **Every school day is important for every student**.

If you intend taking your child out of the school for **five days or more** you must make a <u>formal</u> <u>application to the Principal</u> <u>in writing</u> and also complete the 'Application for Extended Leave' form</u> which is available from the school office. The application must be submitted at least 4 weeks prior to the expected leave or earlier if possible.

It is important for parents to know that, depending on circumstances, this leave may not be approved. Each application will be considered on an individual basis and could depend on circumstances such as the intention for the leave, your child's attendance and the impact the leave may have on your child's academic progress.

These regulations are in place in all schools in the Parramatta Diocese to make sure that all students have the best opportunity to achieve to their full potential. We appreciate your support and understanding of these requirements.

# **Building Comprehension in Readers**

Over time students build a repertoire of comprehension strategies, finding deeper understanding and connection to text as they become increasingly proficient and independent. *These comprehension strategies need to be explicitly taught, modelled and continually practiced. As well, students need to know that they are expected to continue to use these strategies when reading on their own.* 

**Prior Knowledge:** When we tackle any new content or problem, we draw from what we already know.

- In reading, readers activate what they currently understand or misunderstand about a topic and use this knowledge before, during, and after reading to clarify misconceptions and help understand the text.
- Basically, we use what we already know to help understand something new.
- A very easy way for students to learn how to do this independently, as well as reinforce this at home, is to draw on the five sense.
- When looking at a new topic, such as the beach, we can ask what we already know about the beach? What could be something that we may see there?
- What may we hear there or feel?
- When I am at the beach what smells are common and what may I taste?

There are many ways to focus on our current knowledge. By doing this though, we unearth language that we may be likely to come across and we start to build a mental image of the context that could be found within the text. The world of the new and the unknown is no longer as daunting.

## Some Questions to Ask in Creating Successful Reading at Home

Is reading at home fun and enjoyable? Are distractions like the TV and other devices minimised or turned off completely? Are adults seen as readers themselves? Has there been a chance to visit the local library?
