SAFETY of STUDENTS at ST JOHN VIANNEY'S

At St John Vianney's Parish school all staff are responsible for the safety and wellbeing of the students from the time they walk through the gate until they leave in the afternoon. This is what is legally referred to as our '**Duty of Care'**. The safety of each student is also important OUTSIDE the school property. It is for this reason that protocols and procedures (rules) were put in place to cover a number of aspects such as after school pick up, parking, use of pedestrian crossings, etc.

These procedures require the cooperation of parents and carers. It is difficult for the school to ensure students are safe and supervised when parents decide to 'bend' or change the rules, often for their own convenience and not the safety of their children.

INFORMATION SENT HOMES

Primary Cross Country & Ice Block Stall Friday 24th March We all need to be mindful that we (the adults) are the role models and educators when it comes to road and child safety practices and respect for rules. I urge you to PLEASE be respectful and supportive of these procedures:

- Be punctual (school begins at 8:55am)
- If you're late in the morning YOU must fill in the late note at the office not the child!
- Use the pedestrian crossing to cross your child
- DO NOT park on the opposite side of the school and allow your child to run across the road (All young children MUST hold the adult's hand when crossing the road)
- Children should get out of a parked car on the KERB SIDE and be crossed over the road by the adult (Cameron St is VERY NARROW when cars are parked on both sides.... this makes it DANGEROUS as passing traffic has limited space to get through (open car doors don't help)
- Obey 'No parking/No standing' signs (it's illegal not to!)
- **DON'T** park across driveways to drop off or pick up children (illegal)
- **DON'T** pull into the driveway to drop off or pick up children (illegal)
- PLEASE BE CONSIDERATE OF OTHER DRIVERS LIMITED PARKING SPACES IN THE MORNING AT DROP OFF TIME (be quick)
- DON'T double park...especially in the afternoon ...you are creating a traffic hazard!!!
- PLEASE ...DON'T ask your child to wait on the church steps to be picked up after school ...they are unsupervised
- ALL STUDENTS BEING PICKED UP MUST WAIT IN THE AMPHITHEATRE WITH THE SUPERVISING TEACHER AFTER SCHOOL (supervision finishes at 3:30pm) If you're running late RING the SCHOOL!
- ALL 3 CARPARKS are for STAFF USE ONLY!! (Even on rainy days!)
- Please don't open the gate of the lower church car park and drive in....it's for staff only and they can't get out safely! (and someone will tell us at the office if you do)
- PLEASE DON'T ask your child to wait outside the school fence after school (they are unsupervised!) You need to park and collect them from the amphitheatre
- Children who are not picked up and walk home towards Hill End Rd or need to cross Cameron St MUST meet Mrs Smith on the verandah in front of the office.

A number of parents have commented about the bridge gate not being open before 3pm. This gate will remain locked until 3pm for 2 reasons:

1) <u>Child protection concerns</u> – any stranger can simply wander into the school unnoticed as this area is not in view of any staff members. Technically no parent should be on the school premises before 3pm unless they have signed in at the office. Can you imagine the chaos if everyone who came early tried to sign in? I suggest that you wait in your car until 3pm and then come into the amphitheatre to collect your child OR come a little later (say 3:15 It's much easier to park.)

2) <u>To minimize the congestion around the pathways to the amphitheatre</u> and enable the teachers to get their classes seated in an orderly and safe way. All we ask is that you please keep the pathways from the infants building and near the back of the office clear! This also applies on wet days when the pick up is in the Multi-purpose room (Please don't congregate in the entry foyer or canteen area.)

My sincere thanks to those parents and carers who diligently follow procedures and work WITH the school to ensure their children's safety. Your support is greatly appreciated.

It is a system requirement that child protection training be completed by all volunteers commencing work in our school and a briefing every second year for existing volunteers.

- 3. Complete and submit quiz questions. This will take approximately 45 minutes.
- 4. After successful completion of the module, fill out the form by typing your name, email address, contact number, contact address and the school you intend to volunteer at.
- 5. A notification of your successful completion of the module will be sent via e-mail to the school and also to your email address.
