SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

At St John Vianney's Parish school, we continue to promote student attendance. **Thank you to our parents for the support and value that you place on your child being at school each day.**

- Regular school attendance plays a critical role in ensuring that every student has access to the same learning opportunities.
- When students are not at school, are late to school or leave school early, they are missing out on so much that can impact on their future learning.
- As you can see our **current school average is 83.8%** which is **well below** our target of 90%.
- **We love seeing you at school and ready for learning. Let's make regular school attendance a priority for every family.**

APPLICATION FOR EXTENDED LEAVE

Parents, as you know, **it is very important that children attend school every day.** Quite often leave is requested by parents for various reasons. While we understand that this may be necessary sometimes, it is not encouraged. **Every school day is important for every student.**

If you intend taking your child out of the school for **five days or more** you must make a formal application to the Principal in writing and also complete the '**Application for Extended Leave**' form which is available from the school office. The application must be **submitted at least 4 weeks prior to the expected leave** or earlier if possible.

It is important for parents to know that, depending on circumstances, this leave may not be approved. Each application will be considered on an individual basis and could depend on circumstances such as the intention for the leave, your child's attendance and the impact the leave may have on your child's academic progress.

These regulations are in place in all schools in the Parramatta Diocese to make sure that all students have the best opportunity to achieve to their full potential. We appreciate your support and understanding of these requirements.

LITERACY

1. Sharing a book at home

Together with your child, you can enjoy sharing reading. Children love to hear a story read aloud.

- ▶ Try reading with different voices, lots of emotion, invented sound effects and funny faces. Change the tone in your voice, vary the loudness or softness of your voice. Have fun and enjoy it.
- ▶ It is a good idea to practise reading before sharing a book.
- ▶ Listen to your child talk about the story and the pictures.
- ▶ Try asking your child which parts of the books he or she found exciting, funny or different.
- ▶ Give your child the chance to choose a book to read.
- ▶ Try reading to your child and, at other times, ask your child to join reading the book.
- ▶ Let your child hear how *hill* and *home* start with the same sound or how *trouble* and *bubble* rhyme.


Dear Parents,

Problem solving is an important component of mathematics education because it is a skill which can enhance *logical reasoning*.

It is the vehicle which seems to be able to help students achieve all three of the values of mathematics *functional, logical and aesthetic*. It teaches and reinforces mathematical knowledge and helps to meet everyday challenges. Approaching mathematics through problem solving can create a context which simulates real life and therefore justifies the mathematics rather than treating it as an end in itself. The skill of problem solving encompasses skills and functions which are an *important part of everyday life*.

When your child is provided with a Maths problem, it is important to encourage them to find multiple approaches to solving one problem and explain how they got their answer to a problem and discuss alternative ways of doing it. Ask your child to explain their thinking and how they worked it out. Discussing the efficiency and suitability of different strategies is an important part of maths lesson. Explaining strategies orally helps to develop the use of appropriate mathematical vocabulary.

Listed below are steps that you can encourage your child to take when solving problems;
