It was also wonderful to witness the candles that were presented by our school community being lit as a focus around the memorial during the service. These candles represented each of the soldiers whose names appear on the Blacktown RSL memorial. It was a real testimony to the hard work of Mrs Kersivien, Mrs Rose, Mrs Hastings and all the Year Six students!

Our 'ANZAC Awareness Activities' last Thursday were also a great success. The students had the opportunity to work in mixed groups across all grades from K-6. Thank you to all staff for presenting and leading these activities with your group of students. A huge thank you to Mrs. Kersivien for preparing a fantastic session of activities for all our students to participate in. These experiences gave meaning and insight into ANZAC Day, and what it means to all of us as Australians. The children have taken home the symbols of ANZAC day that they created during this time. I hope they have had the opportunity to share this learning with you.

Mrs Rutherford and her Year 6 students did a fantastic job in drawing upon all of these experiences in our ANZAC Day Assembly. We were able to gather and reflect as a school community to not only commemorate the sacrifices that men and women have made over the years, but in particular remember those soldiers researched by our year Six students. This was also a significant time to pray for the immense need for 'Peace in our World'. As a school, both students and teachers, made a pledge for Peace, by presenting signed canvases as part of the assembly. This reinforced our learning that 'Peace begins with us and is built one person at a time'. Let us share this message with our children, and try to live it within our families and the wider community. Thank you Mrs Rutherford for your organisation and preparation of this beautiful and memorable ANZAC Day Assembly.

MORNING ASSEMBLY & SUPERVISION CHANGES

With the ever increasing demands on the learning agenda it is sometimes necessary for us to review practices to enable us to optimize the time teachers and students have available to them for enriching and deep learning.

Recently the staff spent some time discussing how we might best address this issue. We found that approximately 100 minutes (1Hr 40mins) of learning time each week is lost through our daily morning assemblies. While these are also an important aspect of life at St John Vianney's, we believe some change is needed.

The following changes will commence from next week (Monday 8th May):

- ♦ Students sit and wait in the amphitheatre each morning until supervision begins at 8:30am (NO student should be here before 8am)
- Students will be moved to the GRASS area for play by supervising teachers
- Bell rings at 8:55am and students will be directed to the amphitheatre for assembly
- ♦ MORNING ASSEMBLY WILL BE ON MONDAY ONLY IN THE AMPHITHEATRE. All students celebrating birthdays that week will be announced and congratulated. Any special news eg First Communion etc will also be shared.
- When Monday is a public holiday or Staff Development Day, the assembly will be on Tuesday.
- ♦ If the amphitheatre is too wet, Monday morning assembly will be in the Multi-Purpose Room
- For the remainder of the week, students will line up in designated places when the bell rings and will move directly into their classes with their class teacher
- Major presentations eg sports awards, ICAS awards/trophies etc will be done at the Friday Merit Assembly at 2:15pm

At least 20 valuable minutes of learning will be reclaimed each day with these changes. I know that each of you value your child's learning opportunities and hope that you will be supportive of this initiative which we believe will be of benefit to our students.

NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual national assessment for all students in **Years 3, 5**, 7 and 9. All students in these year levels are expected to participate in tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

NAPLAN is the measure through which the government, education authorities, schools, teachers and parents can determine whether or not our students are meeting important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy. The tests provide parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. They also provide schools, states and territories with information about how education programs are working and what areas need to be improved. NAPLAN tests are just **ONE** aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process; they do not replace the extensive ongoing assessments made by teachers about each student's performance.

This year the NAPLAN test will take place in Week 3 of Term Two, on Tuesday 9th May, Wednesday 10th May and Thursday 11th May.

May - Month of Mary

May is a special month in the Catholic Church as it is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. During May we remember and honour our holy mother Mary and we encourage families to pray the Rosary more often during this time.

At St. John Vianney's the Year 3-6 children have the opportunity to pray the Rosary every Monday at lunchtime and we thank our volunteer **Mrs Jane Buttigieg and Mr Bernard D'Souza** for generously leading the children in prayer each week.

Pope Francis will be visiting Fatima in Portugal during May to mark the 100th anniversary of the Marian apparitions of Fatima. These Marian apparitions began on the 13th May 1917 when three shepherd children saw the Virgin Mary and these apparitions continued on the 13th of each month until October. During this first apparition Our Lady asked the children to pray the Rosary and the children did this. Pope Francis has confirmed that he will canonize Francisco and Jacinta Marto, the shepherd children and visionaries of Fatima, when he visits Fatima in May to mark the 100th anniversary of the apparitions of Mary on the site.
