Dear Parents,

Last Sunday, September 4th 2016, Pope Francis officially **declared Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta**, known as the 'saint of the gutters' during her life, **a saint**. This nun and Nobel Peace laureate, worked among the world's poorest in the slums of the Indian city now known as Kolkata (Calcutta).

One of her most basic teachings says: **"The fruit of faith is love".** Here she reminds us that love is not a mere feeling; it is always expressed in action: "Love in living action" anywhere and anytime! In one of her public addresses **St Teresa said' "... love cannot remain still. It has to get into action, and that action is service. That action is love for one another."**

One of the ways St Teresa proved her love was by **doing little things for** others, small acts of love that made the other feel welcomed, loved, cared for. However it wasn't just doing the 'little things' that was important for her..... it was that those little things be **done with 'great** love'. When she spoke of 'little things', St Teresa would say, "... maybe just a little smile, maybe just a little shake of the hand, maybe just a little flower..."

St Teresa of Kolkata had a deep sense of the sacredness and dignity of the human person, looking beyond race, religion, nationality, social standing or a person's sinfulness. She could only see every human being as a child of God, created in the image of God.

I think it quite fitting that St Teresa's canonisation took place during this Holy Year of Mercy. **She embodied all that is God's mercy and compassion.** We can learn much from her example and like her, **strive to be attuned to God working in our lives** and to **seek His will in every event**. She has shown us the way. Like her, we too can do 'ordinary things with extraordinary love.'

St Teresa was called to holiness. But the call to holiness is not a gift reserved for a few. We can **all aspire to holiness** because it is a goal within the capacity of ordinary persons ... those who are **prepared to put their faith into action** to be the "carriers of God's love".... to **be His love, His compassion, His presence** in the difficult and challenging times of daily life.

St Teresa of Kolkata, pray for us.
