## **Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy**

The year of Mercy began on Tuesday December 8, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Our Lady and the Fiftieth anniversary of the closing of the Second Vatican Council. Pope Francis has explained his plans for the Jubilee Year of Mercy in an interview with the Italian magazine Credere. "I believe that this is the time for mercy," the Pope said. "We are all sinners, all of us carry inner burdens."

Explaining his decision to call for a Jubilee year, the Pope said: The world needs to discover that God is the Father, that there is mercy, that cruelty is not the way, that condemnation is not the way. Everyone needs mercy, the Pope said. Reflecting on his own failings, he disclosed: "I still make mistakes and commit sins, and I confess every fifteen or twenty days." The Jubilee Year might help the faithful to recognise "the maternal dimension of God," the Pope observed.

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
#### **Religious Education News**
