CONTINUING MAINTENANCE AND UPGRADE WORKS

During the last few months we having been carrying out works to refurbish toilets and complete other maintenance work around the school. The next lot of work will be in the Infants' Toilet block. The work will consist of repairs to cubicle partitions and doors, replacement of ceiling tiles, painting, cleaning, repair and sealing of floor and skirting tiles and some gyprock work. These works are being generously funded by the Catholic Education Office Parramatta but MUST be completed before the end of term. To accommodate this the infants' toilets will be out of commission for 3 weeks of this term. (from Mon 28/11 until Fri 16/12). The students from K-2 will use the new Years 3/4 toilets. I am truly indebted to CEDP for supporting the school financially to ensure that the much need maintenance and upgrades could be completed.

CLASS PLACEMENTS

When making the decision as to which class students are placed in for the following year, teachers spend a great deal of time in discussion with their grade partner and myself to achieve class groupings that work best for the students, taking into account a number of factors students' learning needs, relational considerations, special needs, gender balance and ability ranges. Students being with their best friend(s), cousin, etc or their preferred teacher may not be the optimum placement. With that in mind I ask that parents do not make requests as to their child's class placement for next year. If there is a **serious concern**, then please make an appointment to discuss this with Mrs Cox. The final decision on class placement rests with the Principal and I would hope that parents would respect and support the professional judgement of our highly skilled teachers. Thank you.

First Holy Communion
