Religious Education Goal for 2019

"For students to begin to engage in the inquiry process for learning and to consolidate the use of the Senses."

The Diocesan Religious Education Curriculum currently in place is 'Sharing Our Story.' The Catholic Education Diocese is in the process of reviewing this document and a new curriculum will begin to be implemented in some of our schools this year, with the remaining schools commencing in 2020.

At St John Vianney's Parish School we place a high priority on ensuring our students have a sound knowledge of the Catholic Faith and Catholic Traditions. Our teachers use the St John Vianney's Parish Catechism to assist students to broaden their knowledge of Church teachings.

This year the staff will be working to building their understanding and use of the inquiry process for learning. The overall goal of the inquiry process is for students to actively make meaning and build new understandings. Students are encouraged to investigate widely and deeply, make sense of new information to build on prior knowledge, present and share their knowledge with others and reflect on what they have learned.

Staff will also be participating in various professional learning activities throughout the year to continue to refine the teaching and learning strategies that they use with students to teach Scripture. Currently the teaching of Scripture is supported by the 'Senses of Scripture' which is a way that teachers and students look at the levels of understanding that exist within a Scripture passage. There are three 'Senses':

- Literal Who? What? When? Where? What is the geographical and historical context of the Scripture?
- Spiritual What does this Scripture passage reveal about God/Jesus? What sacraments are present? What Catholic Value is revealed in this Scripture?
- Application What does the Scripture passage call me to do with my life?

SCHOOL ATTENDANCEEVERY LEARNER, EVERY DAY!

- School attendance plays a critical role in enhancing the lives of students in schools.
- Every day of attendance adds to a students' academic achievement and success at school.
- If a student is not at school, they can't be part of the learning.
- ♦ A student who is consistently late to school misses the learning too!
- School attendance is compulsory for every school age student.

It's OK to NOT be at school if you are sick or there is some kind of disaster ...but it is not OK to be away because you slept in, didn't feel like coming to school, went shopping, met up with friends.

At St John Vianney's we are monitoring school attendance as one part of building your child's success at school. We will communicate with you if we become concerned about your child's attendance.

If your child's attendance is less than 90% attendance for this term, we will contact you either by phone or letter to make you aware of your child's attendance rate.

Parents can help by promoting the importance of school by:

- √ ensuring your child attends school every day
- √ arriving at school punctually (school begins at 8:55am)
- √ leading by example ... be organised and ready

We are keen to support parents in developing and consolidating good attendance habits in every student.

ABSENT FROM SCHOOL

If your child is away from school could you please advise the office via phone, email or the Skoolbag App by 9:30am on the day they are absent. Thank you!

ABSENCES

It is an expectation that student attend school every day and arrive on time. The school day begins at 8:55am and ends at 3pm. If your child is away due to sickness, medical appointment or a family matter a note or doctor's certificate should be sent to the classroom teacher on their return to school. If you are intending to take your child out of school for leave for less than 5 days please send a note to the class teacher or contact the school office by phone, email or via the Skoolbag App.

APPLICATION FOR EXTENDED LEAVE

If the period of leave is for 5 days or more, please provide a letter to the Principal detailing the reasons for extended leave and attach the completed Application for Extended leave. There is no guarantee that extended leave will be approved. All applications are considered on an individual basis, taking into account the reason for leave, the student's academic progress, their attendance history and the impact this leave may have on the student's progress.

These regulations are in place in all schools in the Parramatta Diocese to make sure that all students have the best opportunity to achieve to their full potential. We appreciate your support and understanding of these requirements.

Reading @ Home - The Number One Home Learning Focus

Last year we began a revised school homework policy which placed reading as the central focus of home study. In setting reading as our central focus we aim to:

- develop rigorous daily reading habits
- an awareness of the breadth of texts that students are able to access
- help students come to know themselves as readers and what texts they particularly enjoy
- build skills in deciphering text as well as comprehending challenging texts.

In developing these, we aim to build in our students independence and proficiency in all forms of reading, but more importantly, **to nurture a love of reading** which will go with them into their adutlhood.

Students have Reading Logs to track their reading across the week as well as the term. Nightly reading is important to develop that routine and regular place of reading in the day. Of course students from Kinder to Year 6 are on a continuum of independence though we aim to build this across the years so that older students are taking the responsibility of their own reading. Parents are co-pilots in this endeavour and need to be able to support regular reading through discussion, supporting sourcing texts as well as signing student Reading Logs.

Reading **is** personal. The individual determines where and when reading is best done - though parents need to guide this decision, creating a realistic and worthwhile schedule.

Reading for Learning at home cannot be seen as optional, as unstructured, or as a soft answer to an otherwise heavily prescribed written homework format. Parents need to model the mind-set that home reading is a clearly defined home learning task, is mandatory, has determined time frames and needs to be recorded. A positive approach to home reading as learning will plant a seed that can grow into a vibrant literary mind-set.


