#### ATTENDANCE and EXTENDED LEAVE

As you can see from the information above, our attendance data is not looking too healthy! The expected Diocesan benchmark for all schools is at least 90% attendance. We are falling well short of this and I'm urging every parent to give serious consideration to your child's daily attendance and learning.

I realise there have been issues with viruses and other illnesses recently, but our school attendance rate is declining! We are **ALL responsible** for ensuring that our students are **at school EVERY DAY and ON TIME!** There has been a marked increase in the number of families requesting Extended Leave for holidays during crucial learning time. **Please be advised, unless the extended leave is for urgent or serious reasons, approval may not be granted.** 

I remind parents, that a **letter explaining** <u>in detail</u> the reason for the leave MUST accompany the application for extended leave. All applications are considered individually and take into consideration each student's learning.

We are monitoring each student's attendance (this includes partial attendance). If a student's attendance falls below 90% we will contact parents by phone or letter to bring this to your attention.

Please contact the school office by phone (8869 6300), email or via the Skoolbag App on the morning that your child is absent so this can be recorded, and their class teacher informed. An absence of 3 days or more without notification to the school will result in a call from the school.

#### **OPERATION ART NEWS**

Operation Art is an initiative of the Children's Hospital at Westmead in association with the NSW Department of Education.

This program provides a forum for students from across NSW to demonstrate their visual arts achievements through exhibitions at the Armory Gallery, Sydney Olympic Park and the Art Gallery of NSW.

150 artworks are selected each year for further exhibition opportunities including 50 artworks being selected for a tour of regional galleries and then given to the Children's Hospital at Westmead.



## Audiobooks - Another Way of Reading

In asking students what they think a good reader looks like, most talked about reading aloud. Can someone use expression, how fluently they read, and things like that. Many didn't consider that most reading occurs silently in your mid, and that good reading is mostly about what you think about. The point I want to make though, is that there are many kinds of reading, and exposure to as many forms as possible is a good thing.

Throughout this year I have tried to promote the online resources available to all students through the Parramatta classm8 - elibrary portal. Students have available to them a wealth of eReaders and audiobooks.



This term, Year 4 are listening to their serial reader 'Winterhouse' by Ben Guterson as an audiobook, instead of having us teachers read it aloud. Feedback from the students has so far been very positive with comments such as: 'I like that the narrator uses all different sorts of voices for the characters.' 'It's good because the reader is really clear and uses lots of expression.'

Audiobooks are a great way for children to access quality literature, modelled by expert readers. They are accessible at times when reading would be otherwise difficult too. Long car trips are a great opportunity to listen to a story. Children can listen, and otherwise not have their eyes glued to a screen. I know that many

adults choose to plug into a book while being involved in mundane tasks such as cleaning the house, gardening or while enjoying a walk or jog. It is important to point out that audiobooks do not replace other forms of reading. When engaged in a book with print, a child's focus is greater as it requires more concentration and senses. But audiobooks offer a different

experience of literature that is really worth exploring.

There are many audiobook Apps available. I have used Audible for some time now with many a happy hour listening to a range of books. Otherwise students can access free audiobooks from the *elibrary* through *classm8*.


He also cried out for the world to hear, "I love this drawing caper. I must begin my masterpiece before another second passes", and that's what he would have done if he hadn't lost his glasses!



#### No Parking

No waiting. You have \$183 2 minutes to drop-off or pick-up. You must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle.



#### No Stopping

You must not stop on a \$330 length of road with a No Stopping sign. The first 10m

from an intersection is a no stopping zone Yellow kerb lines are also No Stopping zones.



#### **Bus Zone**

Only a public bus can stop in a bus zone.

Do not park on or across a driveway or footpath.

Illegal on or near a pedestrian crossing and across double white lines.
