Holy Communion

In the coming months we pray for all those children from St John Vianney's Parish who are preparing to receive Jesus for the first time in the Eucharist.

For Catholics, the Eucharist, or Holy Communion, (one of the three Sacraments of Initiation) is the most profound way we encounter the real presence of Jesus Christ.

The word 'communion' means to be united with, and the word 'Eucharist', comes from a Greek word meaning 'thanksgiving'.

The Church describes the Eucharist as the source and summit of the Christian life. The Eucharist is a celebration of Jesus' love for us.

It has three dimensions:

- · It is a meal
- It is a sacrifice
- · It is a memorial

Today, when we celebrate the Eucharist we share the **meal** that Jesus shared with his Apostles at the Last Supper. In the Eucharist we receive the body and blood of Jesus who **sacrificed** His life for us. Jesus died to save us from sin and to be forgiven. Every time we hear the words at Mass each week, "Do this in Memory of Me', we remember the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper and Jesus' sacrifice for us.

Jesus is present in the Eucharist. In Holy Communion we receive Jesus. The outward or visible sign is bread and wine, but it *is Jesus who we receive*, and we call this the real presence. When we receive Jesus in the Eucharist we are nourished spiritually. The Eucharist brings the worshipping community together into the **Body of Christ**.

As a school community, let us keep in our prayers the students and their families from our parish who will be receiving the *Sacrament of the Eucharist* for the first time on 24th November, 2019.

National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) - 2019

All Year 3 and Year 5 students received their NAPLAN results last Thursday. Each child received an individual student summary and report showing his or her results against key national information.

While NAPLAN tests are only one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process; they serve some value to schools by providing a snapshot in time of how students are progressing.

An analysis of our students' collective NAPLAN results shows **GREAT gains and above expected growth for our students that are above the State and School's Statistically Similar School Group for Reading, Writing, Spelling and Grammar & Punctuation.**

Year 5 at St John Vianney's averaged a **Band** 7 (2nd top Band) for Reading, Writing, Spelling and Grammar & Punctuation and Band 6 (top Mid Band) for Numeracy. The 2019 NAPLAN data also provides school average scores that are compared to State and School's Statistically Similar School Group averages as tabled below.

Year 3 at St John Vianney's averaged a **Band 5 (2nd top Band)** for **Reading**, **Writing**, **Spelling and Grammar & Punctuation** and **Band 4 (top Mid Band) for Numeracy.** Our Year 3 averages were **also impressive in areas of Reading**, **Writing**, **Spelling**, **Grammar and Punctuation**, **obtaining results that were above the State averages** as tabled below.

Dear Parents and Carers,

Problem solving is a fundamental means of developing mathematical knowledge at any level. It allows students to develop the ability to make choices, interpret, formulate, model and investigate problem situations, and communicate solutions effectively. They formulate and solve problems when they use mathematics to represent unfamiliar or meaningful situations, design investigations and plan their approaches, apply strategies to seek solutions, and verify that their answers are reasonable.

Here are some open ended Maths tasks that children can solve to help them develop problem solving skills:

Penny's favourite pizza restaurant offers 6 toppings: ham, onions, mushrooms, pineapple, tomato and peppers.

Penny orders a pizza with ham and pineapple.

Unfortunately the server only writes down that she wants 2 toppings but doesn't write down what they are. The cook decides to pick two toppings at random.

What is the probability that Penny will get the pizza she ordered?




- A. In the mall there is a bubble gum machine. Ms Mataira's twins each want a bubblegum ball of the same colour. There are only blue and yellow balls in the machine and each ball costs 50c. How much money must Ms Mataira spend to be sure to get two bubble gum balls of the same colour?
- B. The next day Ms Mataira sees a different bubblegum machine. This one has three colours blue, yellow and red. What is the most Ms Mataira might have to spend?
- C. Mr Smith passes the 3-colour machine with his three children each of whom wants the same colour ball. How much will he have to spend?



Jim has ten tiles with a different digit on each of them.

He discovers that he can use the tiles to make a lot of nine-digit numbers that are divisible by nine.

How many can he make?



How many 2-digit numbers are there that contain at least one 2?


How many 2-digit numbers are there that contain at least no 2 at all?
