NEW FENCES

As many of you have seen, new perimeter fences and gates have been installed. These were erected to ensure the safety of all students and staff during the school day and is a requirement for all schools. I sincerely hope you will be supportive of this, even though it may cause some inconvenience. Thank you!

This will mean there will be some changes to access!

- **ALL new gates will be unlocked at 8:15am each school day.** Supervision of students begins at 8:30am. Children cannot be dropped off to wait outside the school.
- **ALL new gates will be locked at 9am each school day and will remain locked until 3pm.** Parents are requested to wait outside the school grounds or in their cars until 3pm unless you have office business to attend to.
- In the event you are running late in the morning, you will still have access to the office so you can fill in the late note for your child.
- If you have an urgent need to pick up your child early, you will still have access to the office to complete the early departure note for your child.
- **Gates will be locked for the night at 4pm each school day.**
- Gates will remain locked on weekends and during school holidays.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Parents are reminded that students will be required to wear their summer uniform in Term Four. **Due to the unseasonal weather we are asking parents to use their discretion in deciding which uniform is best suited, summer or winter, during the remainder of this Term. It will be compulsory for all children to be wearing their full summer uniform from Monday 14th October, Week 1 of Term 4.**

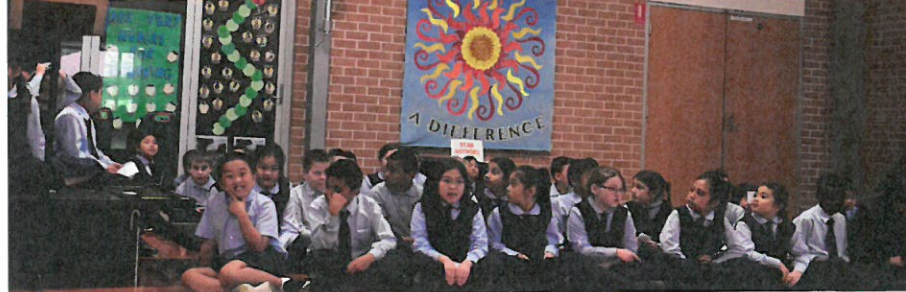
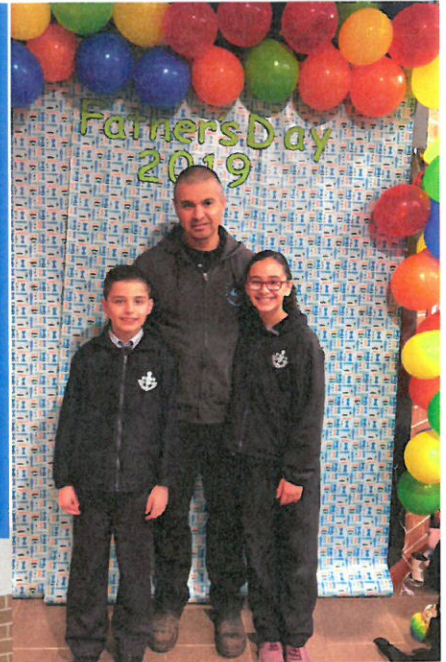
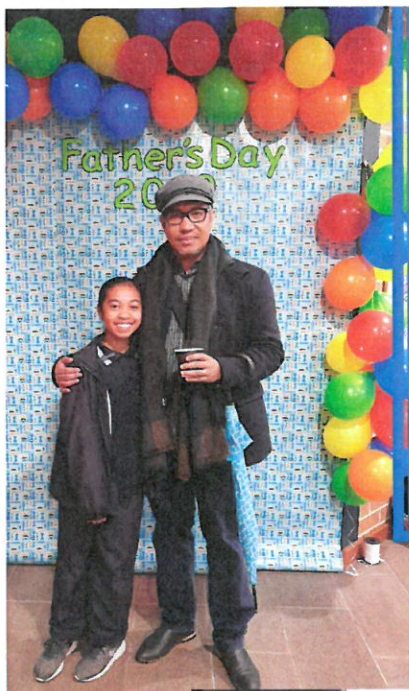

Laudato Si

Laudato Si is an encyclical written by **Pope Francis in 2015**. A **papal encyclical** is one of the highest forms of communication by the pope and usually deals with some aspect of **Catholic teaching**- *clarifying, amplifying, condemning or promoting* one or a number of issues.

On Care for Our Common Home (Laudato Si') is the new appeal from **Pope Francis** addressed to "**every person living on this planet**" for an inclusive dialogue about how we are shaping the future of our planet. Pope Francis calls the Church and the world to acknowledge the urgency of our environmental challenges and to join him in embarking on a new path. This encyclical is written with both hope and resolve, looking to our common future with candor and humility.

The **encyclical** takes its name from the invocation of **Saint Francis of Assisi**, "**Praise be to you, my Lord**" which in the *Canticle of the Creatures* reminds us that the earth, our common home "is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us" . We ourselves "are dust of the earth (cf. Gen 2:7); our very bodies are made up of the elements, we breathe the air and we receive life and refreshment from the waters".

The Season of Creation

It is timely that we think about the care of our common home during the *Season of Creation*.

The Season of Creation is an annual celebration of prayer and action to protect creation. The season begins **September 1st**, the Day of Prayer for Creation and runs through **October 4th**, the **Feast of St. Francis**, who is the patron saint of ecology. The theme of this year's celebration is '*the web of life*'.

I encourage you to talk to your children about the gift of creation, especially of our common home *Australia* and how each of us are called to *care* and *protect* this *great south land of the Holy Spirit*.

Perhaps as a family, during this season we can remember the words of St Francis and pray his special prayer.

Peace Prayer of Saint Francis

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace:
where there is hatred, let me sow love;
where there is injury, pardon;
where there is doubt, faith;
where there is despair, hope;
where there is darkness, light;
where there is sadness, joy.

O Divine Master, grant that I may
not so much seek
to be consoled as to console,
to be understood as to understand,
to be loved as to love.

For it is in giving that we receive,
it is in pardoning that we are pardoned,
and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.
Amen.

Writing Across the School!

Over the weeks I have been focussing on Reading. But that does not mean that there hasn't been great writing going on too! Here is a peak into the brilliant writing across our grades:

Kindergarten: Today in Kindergarten we were writing about animals. Our teacher read us a story called The Tusk Fairy about an elephant. We wrote about the elephant and we were using adjectives. I used the word 'old'. We have been writing all about different animals like farm animals too. **Isabelle**

Year 1: I am in One Gold, and we have been writing about Fairy Tales. Most of all we have been writing about Little Red Riding Hood, The Three Little Pigs and the Three Bears. I wrote a story about the Three Little Pigs and they were going to build their own house and two pigs built their houses with the wrong material and their houses fell down. It was three pages long! We used adverbs and describing words to describe the hay, and sticks and bricks. **Alexis**

Year 2: We've been writing persuasive texts in Year 2 about The Day the Crayons Came Home, convincing Duncan to come and get us from Africa. We are also convincing him that we are his favourite crayon. My colour was turquoise. I said that I am the best because you can see turquoise in Duncan's eyes and on his clothes. We had to use strong words like 'best' and 'most important'. I like persuasive writing best because I like convincing people what the right thing to do is. **Jessica**

Year 3: We have been planning an imaginative text based on the story Florette. The story is about a girl who moves houses, and she wants to bring her garden with her. But there's no room in her new house because she is in the city. I am planning a story where the problem is a tree falls onto a greenhouse and there is only one little plant left. The main character then grows a garden from this plant. We needed to include a treasure jar, a greenhouse and an animal or insect. My animal is a rabbit. **Niya**

Year 4: In Year 4, we have been writing Arguments based on Book Week and Literacy. My argument was Libraries vs Museums. Miss D'Sa and Mr Stennett argued Digital Texts vs Traditional Books and both Year 4 classes got into groups to choose opposing topics. After writing our arguments we got together and presented them to each other. I thought that Libraries are better than Museums because you can touch and use the books, while in a museum you aren't allowed to touch anything. **Maria**

Year 5: In Year 5, we have been looking at natural disasters. We have been writing informative texts based on the book Flood by Jackie French and Bruce Whatley. We wrote descriptive words about rain and looked at a poem that personified the wind. Last week, I wrote an informative text about volcanoes and how volcanoes are formed. I learnt a lot of new words such as phenonema and phrases such as 'beautiful but dangerous'. I like informative texts if I have something to base it on but my favourite type of writing is definitely imaginative because I have a BIG imagination! **Keira**

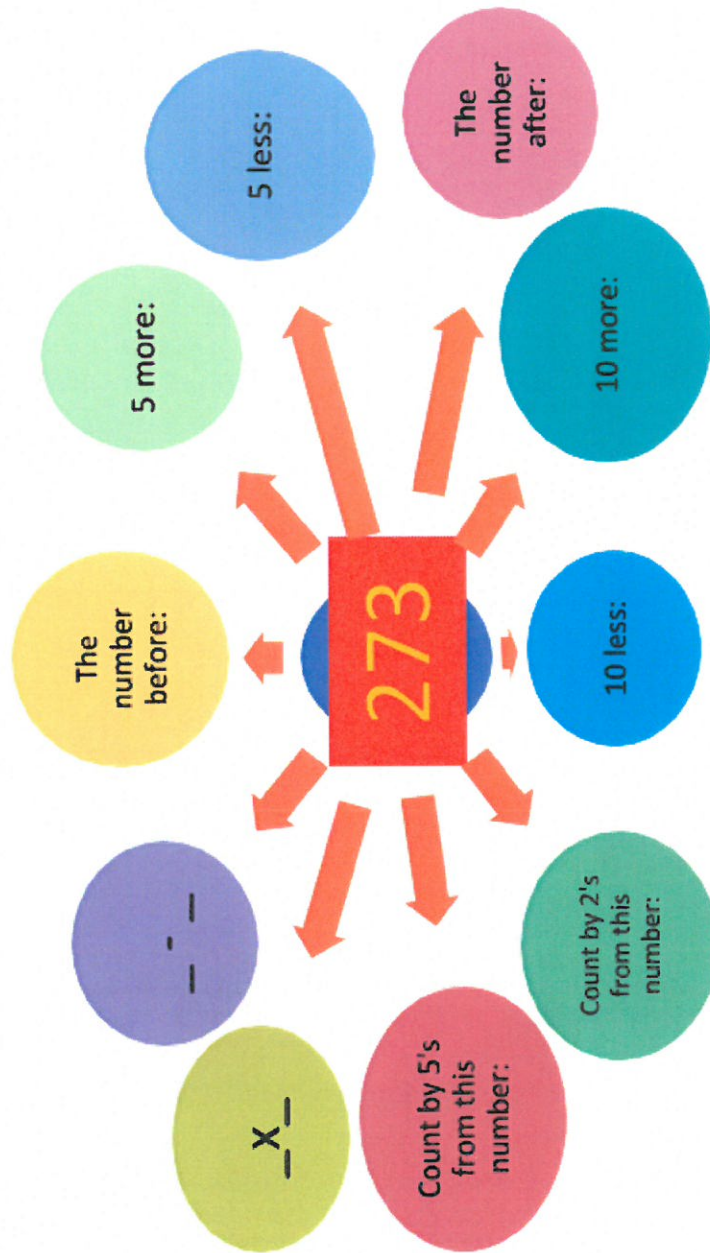

WITHDRAWAL OF ENROLMENT

Please note that under the School Fee Policy as set out by the Catholic Education Office Parramatta:

"A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term.

One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment, that is, the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance".

CITIZENSHIP/CHANGES TO VISA STATUS

If parents or students become Australian citizens at any time during the year, could you please provide a copy of your certificate to the school office so that we can update your child's enrolment file.

Please also advise the office if there are any changes to your Visa status so that we can make the necessary amendments.

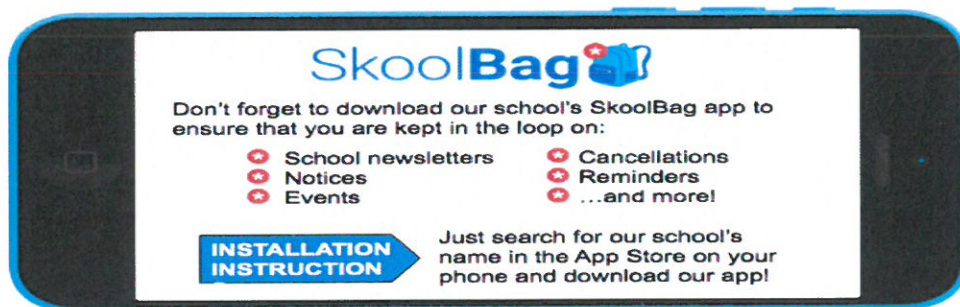

It is a system requirement that child protection training be completed by all volunteers commencing work in our school and a briefing every second year for existing volunteers.
